

ISRAELI INTEGRATION & OVERSEAS CARE

Some Yeshivot offer an Israel experience while others cater to the needs of overseas talmidim. Yeshivat Hakotel offers the best of both worlds, by enabling and encouraging a genuine Israel experience while also offering a staff of overseas Rabbanim and English shiurim uniquely suited to overseas talmidim.

Yeshivat Hakotel Overseas students and Israelis sit together in the Beit Midrash, live together in the dormitory and eat together in the dining room. Special Shabbatot, an accelerated Ulpan, and chavrutot with Israeli students and shiurim with Israeli faculty facilitate integration. Inspirational educational tiyulim connect each talmid to Eretz Yisrael.

A UNIQUE HESDER YESHIVA

There are three models of Hesder yeshivot that accept overseas talmidim.

- One model is the yeshiva which consists of two separate programs one for Israelis and one for overseas talmidim.
- A second model is a yeshiva that consists of just an Israeli program into which overseas talmidim are fully incorporated.
- Hakotel is unique in that it balances between these two models by integrating overseas talmidim with Israelis while offering them the additional shiurim and guidance generally offered to overseas talmidim in separate programs.

Hakotel also proudly offers a broad curriculum (over sixty weekly shiurim in Tanach, Machshava, Halacha, Mussar), a unique location, and meaningful personal relationships with rebbeim and other staff members.

OFFERING THE BEST OF BOTH WORLDS



INTENSIVE GEMARA LEARNING & BROAD CURRICULUM

GEMARA

Being part of a Hesder Yeshiva with seven gradelevels gives talmidim access to shiurim on multiple levels. Three levels of English shiurim are offered for those not yet Hebrew proficient. Our ulpan and other programs prepare Talmidim who are interested for entry into Hebrew shiurim.

IYUN

Shiurim aim to develop learning skills. Rebbeim and shiur assistants are present and actively involved in guiding talmidim throughout each seder.

The Yeshiva also offers different styles of shiurim to allow each talmid to find the approach best suited to him.

With the additional help of night seder chaburot, most talmidim develop the ability to prepare and deliver a Gemara sugya within the first few months in Yeshiva. As part of our 'Chaburah Initiative' Program, staff guide talmidim one-on-one in their independent preparation of chaburot in the course of the year.

BEKIUT

Rebbeim and other Staff learn with small groups of talmidim in the afternoons to help them solidify their reading skills. A number of other opportunities are available to cover the mesechta being learned, daf yomi, and other mesechtot.

BROAD CURRICULUM

Yeshivat Hakotel teaches not only the knowledge, but also the skills necessary to learn Tanach, Jewish Philosophy, Hashkafa, Mussar and Halacha. Shiurim in these areas are offered three times over the course of each day with multiple choices in each slot.

In addition to the Yeshiva's Hebrew shiurim, we offer a comprehensive curriculum of over sixty weekly English shiurim, many of which are accompanied by guided independent study. The array of shiurim helps talmidim meaningfully pursue other areas of Torah learning. (See schedule of shiurim on page 9.)



GLOBAL VISION & PERSONAL ATTENTION

Both the roster of students in the Yeshiva and its philosophy reflect the central concept of kibbutz galuyot (ingathering of exiles). Yeshivat Hakotel's student body consists of Talmidim from more than 12 countries on six continents. All learn with and from one another as a unified Klal Yisrael in the Old City of Yerushalayim.



OLD CITY / HAR HABAYIT

Being only yards away from the site of the Beit Hamikdash enhances one's year in Israel. The unparalleled experience of learning in the Ir Ha'atika (Old City) connects each student to three thousand years of Judaism's past, present and future.

AREIVUT (MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITY)

Yeshivat Hakotel not only encourages a sense of areivut, but also teaches the skills necessary to successfully reach out and affect others. We educate to give, not only to receive. Hakotel believes that Hashem intends for us to engage the world and its people in the hope that we can affect and learn from them. We believe that such a lifestyle can only be lived properly if it is rooted in scrupulous observance and a genuine commitment to Talmud Torah and the pursuit of Hashem's Will.

TRADITION

Yeshivat Hakotel's fifty-five plus year tradition makes it a special place to spend a year. The renowned Rebbeim, close Rebbe-Student relationships, and dancing to the Kotel Friday night are all part of our unique Yeshiva. Our thousands of alumni attest to the extraordinary experience that continues today.

PERSONAL KESHER

Yeshivat Hakotel offers the kind of individual attention and personal relationships generally found in small yeshivot. The uniquely high ratio of staff to Talmidim facilitates close relationships between talmidim and rebbeim who devote themselves to

personal time with each talmid. Most of the Staff lives in the Old City with homes regularly open to talmidim. In addition, the yeshiva helps talmidim form close personal kesharim with junior staff, older talmidim, Israeli talmidim, and other first-year students. Each Talmid has at least at least three older chavrutot in the course of each day.

INDIVIDUALITY

Hakotel believes in diverse paths of Avodat Hashem. We seek to help each talmid develop his own unique relationship with Hashem. In recognition of Chazal's dictum that "Just like their faces are different, so too are their dei'ot (knowledge/opinions)" Hakotel offers a variety of shiurim. Different talmidim are interested in diverse areas of Torah or in alternate methods of studying the same area. Our broad array of shiurim in each area of Torah study ensures that each talmid finds a sufficient selection in whatever area(s) he chooses to focus on. Thus, the program consists of a basic core curriculum in each of the five areas of Torah study (Gemara, Tanach, Machshava/Hashkafa, Mussar and Halacha) buttressed by additional elective options.



IS HAKOTEL RIGHT FOR ME?

FOR WHOM IS YESHIVAT HAKOTEL DESIGNED?

Yeshivat Hakotel's program is designed for dedicated Yeshiva High School graduates who wish to focus on serious, advanced Torah study coupled with religious and personal growth, in an Israeli environment.



HAKOTEL NOURISHES THE INTELLECT AND THE SOUL

Unique uplifting tisches, shabbatonim in special locations (including Tzfat, Chevron, B'nei Brak and others), kumzitzes in special Old City locations (the Kotel, the Kotel HaKatan, overlooking the Har Habayit, ancient shuls) weekly nights with each rebbe, niggun of the week, and other programs supplement the daily learning schedule.

HAKOTEL DEVELOPS INDIVIDUALITY WHILE PROMOTING UNITY

We firmly believe that each talmid should develop his unique derech in avodat Hashem. We work with individual talmidim on helping them accomplish this.

Hakotel fosters the skills and desire necessary for continued Torah learning after Yeshiva and encourages each talmid to examine and enhance his personal identity as a Yiray Shamayim and Eved Hashem.



PHILOSOPHY OF THE YESHIVA

Yeshivat Hakotel was founded as a Hesder Yeshiva more than 50 years ago. The Yeshiva's underlying goal is to cultivate talmidim who are intimately connected to:

TORAH, AM YISRAEL & ERETZ YISRAEL

There is no better place to accomplish this three-fold goal than at Yeshivat Hakotel in the Old City of Yerushalayim.

TORAT YISRAEL

Love of Learning – Developing love for and ability to learn is the Yeshiva's primary objective. Although concentrated in gemara, Yeshivat Hakotel's multifaceted learning program includes significant opportunities to study Tanach, Halacha, Emunah, Machshava, and Mussar in a meaningful way.

AM YISRAEL

Achdut (Unity) – Yeshivat Hakotel fosters Achdut amongst its students by breaking down cultural barriers that often divide Jews of different countries of origin. This feeling of brotherhood permeates all aspects of Yeshiva life including classes, dormitory residence, and leisure time.

Respect By Learning From All – Yeshivat Hakotel very much identifies with the dictum of the Mishnah (Avot 4:1) that the wise man is the one who learns from all people. We broaden talmidim's horizons and help them respect different types of Jews by teaching different types of Jewish philosophies and hashkafot (Litvish, Chasidish, Rationalist, Kabbalistic). The picture below, of four 20th Century Gedolim who represent four key elements of Jewish life, hangs in Rav Taragin's office for talmidim to reflect upon and learn from.





Communal Responsibility – We educate towards being part of the larger Jewish community, which includes the Jews of Yerushalayim, the State of Israel, and around the globe. Although the Yeshiva focuses on Torah learning and personal growth, it also imbues students with a sense of communal responsibility. Yeshivat Hakotel teaches the importance of reaching out to uninformed and assimilated Jews, and imparts the tools necessary to do so.

Chesed – Yeshivat Hakotel inspires communal responsibility by offering many chesed opportunities. The opportunities include visiting and helping the elderly and the sick, volunteering in a local soup kitchen, and packaging food for the needy. In addition, chesed Shabbatonim are held throughout the country.

ERETZ YISRAEL

Hakotel aims to connect talmidim to Am Yisrael's return to Eretz Yisrael. Our talmidim experience and become part of the history and future of Eretz Yisrael. Being at Hakotel is not just learning about our history, but experiencing and becoming part of it. Talmidim connect to the history of Eretz Yisrael as well as the modern miracle of the State of Israel.

Yeshiva tiyulim (tours) are more than just sightseeing events. They connect what talmidim are seeing to what they are learning in the Beit Midrash. Preparatory study in Tanach prior to each tiyul helps talmidim associate sites with their religious and historical significance.

DAILY SCHEDULE

DAILY SCHEDULE

A unique aspect of Yeshivat Hakotel is its emphasis on Tanach, Jewish Philosophy, Mussar, and Halacha. This emphasis is reflected in our extensive array of classes complemented by scheduled time for guided independent study.

We offer talmidim both a carefully balanced core curriculum as well as shiurim in more specified topics of interest to individual talmidim.

ADMINISTRATION



Rav Baruch Wieder, ROSH HAYESHIVA
– Semicha from the Israeli Rabbinate.
He studied at Yeshivat Mercaz HaRav
under Rav Zvi Yehuda HaKohen Kook
Zt"l and in the kollel halacha of Yeshivat
Hakotel over which he later served as
Rosh Kollel. During his army service he

fought in a number of crucial tank battles in the Lebanon War. In addition to yeshiva-wide sichot, Rav Wieder gives a weekly sicha for overseas talmidim and often hosts talmidim at his home in the Old City.



Rav Reuven Taragin, DEAN OF OVERSEAS STUDENTS – is a Wexner Fellow and has Semicha from the Israeli Rabbinate completed a BA in Science and Philosophy at Yeshiva University and an MA in Jewish History and Education at Touro College (Israel).

While in America, Rav Taragin ran shabbatonim for NCSY and created the YUSSR summer program. Rav Taragin is responsible for the quality and message of the overall program and the welfare of each of its students with whom he develops deep personal kesharim. He is well-known for his shiurim in Gemara, Tanach and Machshava, his inspiring talks, signature tisches, and the personal advice he offers to talmidim.



Rav Tuvya Lifshitz, MASHGIACH RUCHANI – studied at Yeshivat Hakotel, has Semicha from the Israeli Rabbinate and a Teacher's Degree from Michlelet Lifshitz. He is well known for his Tanach and Machshava shiurim and for maintaining the yeshiva's unique

atmosphere. He gives a weekly sicha for overseas talmidim and hosts talmidim at his home in the Old City which includes a breathtaking view of the Har HaBayit.



Moti Jerbi, DIRECTOR – has a BA in Education and Communications and Media and is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Israeli Army Reserves, responsible for protecting Israel's southern borders. In addition to his administrative responsibilities, Mr. Jerbi builds

personal relationships with many talmidim.



Rav Uri Goldstein, DIRECTOR OF OVERSEAS PROGRAM – received Semicha from Yeshiva University. Before making Aliyah in 2016, Rav Uri was rabbi of a community in Fair Lawn NJ and taught in Frisch and Maayanot high schools. Along with his wife, Rav Uri

founded the JLIC at UCLA. In addition to his administrative

responsibilities, Rav Uri gives shiurim in Tanach and Jewish Thought at the Yeshiva, and teaches in schools and communities in Yerushalayim and Beit Shemesh.

MORNING SEDER RAMIM FOR SHANA ALEPH OVERSEAS TALMIDIM



Rav Ari Cutler - completed Semicha and an MA in Social Work from Yeshiva University. Rav Cutler gives an interactive in depth gemara shiur rooted in the daf with a special focus on the careful reading and analysis of the Rishonim. He is also known for the

close relationships that he develops with talmidim and his passionate sichot. Rav Cutler also teaches Machshava, Tanach, Iyun Tefilla, and gives special shiurim at the Kotel. He is the founder and director of the Hakotel Bergman Family Leadership Program.



Rav Ari Heller - has Semicha from the Israeli Rabbinate, a BA in Education from Herzog Teacher's College, and a Master's Degree in Judaic Studies from Israel's Ministry of Education. Rav Heller's gemara shiur is unique in that it provides talmidim with solid foundations in both

the textual and conceptual aspects of learning. In addition to his gemara shiur, he gives Shiurim including Neviim Rishonim and "Chassidut & Dessert". He is also known for learning b'chavruta with each of his talmidim.



Rav Jesse Horn - completed a BA in Judaic Studies and MA in Jewish Education and Semicha at Yeshiva University. Rav Horn is known for teaching a methodological Brisker approach to learning. He helps boys develop their own skills by preparing

shiur with them during morning seder. In addition to his gemara shiur, he gives shiurim including Tanach Personalities. His warm personality and deep understanding of talmidim help him forge particularly close relationships. Rav Horn is also a long-time Rebbe at NCSY Kollel.

HASHGACHA STAFF



Rav Dovi Fischer, HEAD OF AFTERNOON/ NIGHT SEDER – is a Graduate and Musmach of YU/RIETS, is a close student and former Shiur Assistant of Rabbi Zvi Sobolofsky and completed an MA in Jewish Education. In addition to his Night Chaburah and having chavrutot

with many talmidim, Rav Dovi gives shiurim including 40 Comprehensive Halachic Topics, teaches a "Niggun Of The Week" and runs the Gemara Megillah Bekiut Incentive Program. He also coordinates and joins the annual Yeshiva

Poland Trip where he plays an important role in the emotional and educational experience for all talmidim. He is known for being very relatable and for making talmidim feel comfortable in Yeshiva. Rav Dovi is also a long-time Divisional Chinuch Head at Camp Morasha.



Rav Efroni Schlesinger, SHANA BET COORDINATOR - received Semicha from Rav Zalman Nechemia Goldberg ZT"L and an M.A. in Jewish Education from Yeshiva University. He is Rav Taragin's Morning Seder Shoel UMeishiv and the coordinator of the Overseas Shana Bet

Program. Over the summer, Rav Efroni runs the High School Beit Midrash Program in Camp Moshava IO for 11th and 12th graders. Rav Efroni made Aliyah from Memphis, TN, and served in the IDF as part of Hakotel's Hesder program. He holds the rank of First Lt. in the IDF reserves. In addition to various weekly Shiurim including Building Your Hashkafa, Rav Efroni gives a Daf Yomi Shiur both in Yeshiva and on YUTorah, and a weekly podcast dedicated to topics in Jewish Philosophy.



Dr. Carl Hochhauser, STAFF PSYCHOLOGIST - received his doctorate in Psychology from Yeshiva University and worked for several years in the United States as a clinical and health/pediatric psychologist. Dr. Hochhauser meets with each talmid individually and is available to speak

with them regarding matters large and small. In addition, he gives shiurim including Philosophy Of Rav Soloveitchik and organizes a special series that helps talmidim deal with the psychological pressures of the year in Israel and a special shana bet seminar on "Dating and Marriage".

REBBEIM



Rav Jason Knapel - ordained at RIETS and also received his BA from Yeshiva College and a MS from the Bernard Revel Graduate School. He worked in Hillel Yeshiva High School in Deal, New Jersey for many years as a teacher, Director of Informal Education, Director



of Judaic Studies and as Assistant Principal. He teaches a popular weekly shiur in Modern Jewish Philosophy at Hakotel.



Ray Dovid Milston – earned a BA in Judaic Studies from Jews College and Semicha from the Israeli Rabbinate. In addition to serving as Director of the Overseas Program at Midreshet HaRova, Rav Milston gives popular shiurim at Hakotel in Mesilat Yesharim and Parshat HaShayua.



Ray Chanoch Teller -

award-winning internationally renowned author, producer, lecturer, and globetrotting Maggid. His scholarship on Holocaust related material has made him the premier docent in Yad Vashem for religious, English-speaking groups.

Rav Teller delivers a popular weekly sicha about Gedolei Yisrael. In addition he is the perennial guide for the yeshiva's visits to Bnei Brak and Meah Shearim.




EXPERIENCE ISRAEL

LIFE IN THE OLD CITY

Learning and Living in the Old City of Yerushalayim is an unparalleled experience.

The beit midrash windows give talmidim a view of the Har Habayit, Har Hazeitim, and the Yerushalayim landscape as they learn and daven. Talmidim develop a true sense of being l'fnei Hashem (in the presence of G-d).



THE OLD CITY EXPERIENCE

Visits to Old City excavations (including under the yeshiva building) that reveal Jewish life thousands of years old connect talmidim to Yerushalayim's history. Looking at, living in, and taking part in contemporary events (like the Yom Hazikaron, Yom Haatzmaut, and soldier swearing in ceremonies) connect talmidim to the process of the renewal of Judaism's future in Israel. Davening and spending time in the Old City shuls, dancing down to the Kotel on Friday nights, and spending chagim opposite the Kotel and Har Habayit are just a few examples of the special moments Yeshivat Hakotel talmidim experience.

THE CAMPUS

Yeshivat Hakotel enjoys a spacious campus (24,000 square yards) which includes the Beit Midrash, 6 dormitories, 2 extensive libraries (Hebrew and English) as well as a computerized shiur library that includes thousands of recorded shiurim, a large dining room and a workout room – all under one roof. In addition, the roof of our Yeshiva provides a breath-taking view of both the new and Old City and the Har HaBayit. The large seven floor complex comprises 10% of the Jewish Quarter.

NEIGHBORHOOD HOSPITALITY

The Yeshiva connects talmidim with Old City families who are tremendous assets for overseas talmidim. These families are carefully chosen for their understanding of talmidim raised abroad and their ability to make talmidim feel at home.

Additionally most of our staff lives on campus or in the Old City. Their homes are constantly open to students.



EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND RECREATION



SPORTS/FITNESS

Talmidim have a daily two-hour afternoon break. In addition to opportunities for relaxation outside the Yeshiva, we offer daily use of our fully equipped exercise/weight room. A certified personal trainer is available on the premises to ensure students a safe and healthy work-out.

Sports facilities are available within close walking distance of the Yeshiva. Talmidim participate in intraand inter- Yeshiva leagues in a variety of sports.

TIYULIM

Hakotel sees Yedi'at Ha 'aretz, familiarity with the Land of Israel, as a basic part of the Israel Yeshiva experience. Our tiyulim include several multiple-day trips (ex: Midbar Yehuda before Sukkot, four days in Negev and Eilat over Chanukah break), over ten Shabbaton weekends (which generally include a trip on Friday) in communities around Israel, and approximately twenty other sightseeing days/afternoons.

Hakotel's trips are unique in that they teach talmidim about the history of our connection to Eretz Yisrael — from Tanach, many with Tanach in hand, through the establishment of Medinat Yisrael until the present.

In addition to the tiyulim within Israel, Hakotel runs a Poland Trip after Sukkot. Members of our staff accompany talmidim on this unique trip and help them internalize the implications of the Holocaust and the founding of the State of Israel. The trip's timing helps enhance the continued year long experience.





CHESED

Hakotel sees chesed as a basic part of being a Ben Torah. Although time in yeshiva should naturally focus on Talmud Torah, it is essential that some time be devoted to doing chesed. We encourage each talmid to be involved in at least one of the number of chesed opportunities we offer during the week and on Shabbatot. These opportunities generally include, amongst other things, visiting hospitals, packaging for the poor, volunteering in soup kitchens, helping elderly and/or boys from weaker socio-economic backgrounds.

YESHIVAT HAKOTEL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Yeshivat Hakotel Leadership Program, is a natural extension of Hakotel's emphasis on Am Yisrael, and the sense of collective responsibility that is Instilled within the talmidim.

The aim of the program is threefold:

- Inspire talmidim to aspire to become leaders
- Develop leadership skills
- Implement those skills in a practical way

Speakers from America and Israel expose the talmidim to various issues and challenges that face contemporary communities.

Students benefit from the mentorship of Rav Yosef Tzvi Rimon, the program's rabbinic mentor, along with notable figures who include Rabbanim, CEO's, communal leads and political figures.

Each mentor and speaker provides a model of a committed Torah Jew engaging in the world around them and impacting it for the better.

The leadership program teaches written and verbal communication skills through programs and projects such as Public Speaking Network, Students of Jerusalem, and and annual "Leadership Sefer" in which each participant publishes articles. In addition, talmidim are exposed to and interact with prominent Jewish leaders through intensive off-campus shabbatons, panel-discussions, and Gedolim trips.

More advanced students build upon skills gained in the General Program through specialised seminars with distinguished figures in the Jewish world and intensive sessions with senior mentors. These skills are reinforced and concretized through theme based Shabbatons and weekly lunches.

Rabbi Ari Cutler guides the program with his staff to build our future Jewish leaders.

Rav Cutler's Leadership program. I heard about all of the amazing opportunities and sessions that came along with the program but never did I ever expect it to be as worthwhile as it has been for the past year. Throughout my experience with the Yeshivat Hakotel Leadership Program, not only have I learned various leadership skills, but I've learned about myself as well. I've learned what my strengths are, and I've worked to strengthen my weaknesses, with the help of the incredible staff. The individual meetings with Rav Cutler and staff have taught me so much about organization and preparation. I was faced with the task of founding a brand new program in Yeshiva called Halacha V'Hachlala which focuses on sensitivity within our everyday interpersonal interactions as well as our sensitivity within Halacha. Working hands on as opposed to watching from the outside was a tremendous learning experience for me. A SAMPLING OF LEADERSHIP PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

CHABURAH FAMILY LEARNING

Each Week, students and family have the opportunity to connect to the Yeshiva experience through a student made chabura on a halachic or philosophical topic connected to the parsha. Additionally, the student preparing the chabura is mentored in how to prepare the source sheet, gaining important skills along the way such as public speaking. The source sheet (now with both Hebrew and English translation) as well as on paper to talmidim and electronically to parents. Our goal is for talmidim to learn how to prepare a shiur and discuss the sources. (And don't worry, you will get to see both the incredible speaker and your wonderful son).

SLICE OF TORAH

A student initiated and led chesed-learning program, which brings individuals with special needs into the Beit Midrash of Yeshivat Hakotel for a learning experience that forges relationships between populations. Participants are empowered to take responsibility for planning all aspects of the program, and making the values of the Beit Midrash available and accessible to all.

PUBLIC SPEAKING NETWORK

The public speaking seminar provides the opportunity for Talmidim to expand and improve the skills necessary to express, present, and communicate their ideas to others. This is an opportunity for participants to develop themselves into confident communicators that will always feel comfortable speaking at any occasion. PSN gathers together talmidim each week where they are encouraged to present a short speech on a given theme while other talmidim listen and learn to give and share constructive criticism. The program concludes with one talmid being chosen to speak spontaneously on a random topic.



KESHARIM FOR LIFE!



Yeshivat Hakotel sees the kesharim (relationships) formed in yeshiva as a central part of yeshiva life - both while there and after.

AMONGST TALMIDIM

Yeshivat Hakotel sees 'dibuk chaveirim' (relationship with fellow talmidim) as a critical facilitator of personal growth while in and after a talmid's time at yeshiva. Kesharim with talmidim from different cities, countries, and backgrounds add even more to each talmid's perspective.

Hakotel makes building meaningful kesharim easier by carefully spreading acceptance across school, cities, and countries and avoiding situations of clicks. We also help talmidim develop relationships through a network of social programming throughout the year, but focused especially on the first months.

Hakotel alumni maintain the kesharim they forge in yeshiva for life!









STAFF - TALMIDIM

Three factors account for the unique nature of the personal, deep, long term kesharim formed between talmidim and Yeshivat Hakotel staff:

- The staff sees forming personal kesharim (and not just teaching) as its goal.
- The exceptionally high staff- student ratio of one staff member per each two talmidim.
- Staff members are assigned to particular talmidim throughout the day. Each shiur group (of about 15 boys) has seven staff members who work specifically and personally with the boys in that shiur.

Yeshivat Hakotel identifies with the dictum that one's students are meant to be viewed and cared for as one's children. The wedding pictures of each talmid that adorn the wall in our office are pictures that say a thousand words.



STAFF - PARENTS

Yeshivat Hakotel sees a talmid's parents as his central mechanchim (educators). Our goal is to reinforce the hashkafa (outlook) talmidim received from their homes. Our goal is not to change talmidim, but help them better identify with and embody the values they already have.

Because we see our role this way, we communicate intensively with parents to ensure that we are helping each talmid grow in a way that appropriately continues their growth and path up to arrival at yeshiva.

This communication begins with the application process. Parallel to meeting potential talmidim at their high schools, we arrange tens of parent meetings so parents can play an informed role in the process. We return to many cities after registration to meet with parents whose sons have registered.

Throughout the months leading up to yeshiva, our office and staff continue communicating with parents. This communication intensifies upon arrival at yeshiva and through the year. Our office sends out a lengthy detailed update each week including pictures.

Each rebbe and our Dean are in touch with each parent throughout the year. Parents receive tens of pictures of their son and comments throughout the year. The kesher continues after the talmid has left yeshiva as well throughout the process of his college life, dating, marriage, and career and family building.

LIFE AFTER YESHIVA

Yeshivat Hakotel staff prepare talmidim for continued growth after yeshiva and help foster such growth by continuing their kesher with talmidim forever.

Yeshivat Hakotel offers ten Y'mei Iyun (afternoons of focused in depth study) and shiurim series that address different aspects of Jewish life talmidim face after yeshiva.

ALUMNI FOLLOW UP

Yeshivat Hakotel sees the kesher with rebbeim/staff as the most important thing talmidim take with them from yeshiva. These relationship serve as anchors for talmidim as they face the challenges of life in a secular world.

The yeshiva staff invests very intensively in continuing the kesher with each alumnus. We keep track of the last time we were in touch with each boy and ensure that we continue to communicate/be there' for each boy.

These continued kesharim are reinforced by multiple yearly events with alumni around the world.

STAYING IN ISRAEL

Thought most of our talmidim return to the countries and cities they came to yeshiva from, a significant number choose Yeshivat Hakotel because its integration make it possible to transition to life in Israel.

The fact that a significant number stay in Israel make doing the army and/or university in Israel after yeshiva much easier as talmidim who can do so as part of a chevra. The significant number of alumni who stay in Israel also facilitates meaningful staff follow up and events with alumni in Israel.























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
