She has made our home into a beacon of Torah and, as was the case with my parents, has maintained an open-door policy allowing our talmidim to share similar experiences to those I had when I was growing up.

Living in the post-Holocaust era and having served as a captain in the Israel Defense Forces, I feel an even greater need to impart my father's teachings and wisdom upon our youth and future generations. Yeshivat Netiv Aryeh is a continuation of his legacy, not only in name, but in its approach to education as well. My father taught me to relate to each student as if he were my own son, sometimes praising, sometimes...

I personally strive to ensure that not only are all the needs of our students met - both within our beautiful Beit Midrash and beyond - but of our alumni as well. We maintain a close relationship with our alumni and are very proud of many who have become leaders in their respective professions and active in their Jewish communities.

What we're all about OUR FOCUS IS YOU

Ours is a world whose over arching hashkafa is the centrality of Torah in the life of every Jew. Accordingly, devotion to Torah study is stressed as the linchpin of Netiv Aryeh's Overseas Program. The program, whose curriculum is specifically designed for overseas students, utilizes both a contentbased and skills-based approach to intellectual growth, that is academically stimulating and educationally challenging. It focuses on enhancing the student's background in and familiarity with Talmudic text, as well as other original sources.



This creates both the desire and skill to continue learning, as the learning process does not end when the student leaves the Yeshiva. College attendance is strongly encouraged, with Kollel programs seen as the rare and unusual option for but a select few.

Historically, our Sages spent carefully balanced days raising children and earning a living, with part of each day spent in prayer and immersed in the depths of Torah study. Our current culture seems to force a choice between the two, and very often one choice may preclude another altogether. This is not the way our Sages lived. Netiv Aryeh is a place where Torah Judaism is the linchpin of day-to-day life, thriving not

only within its walls but also within the hearts of its alumni who make time in their daily routine of earning a living for Torah, Avodah and Gemillut Chassadim Philosophically, our program's perspective is aligned with that of the Religious Zionist movement, and is consistent with the thoughts espoused by HaRav Yosef Dov Soloveitchik zt"I.

Netiv Aryeh strikes the balance of being intellectually rigorous, but, at the same time, wonderfully supportive and nurturing. The Yeshiva's educational philosophy is characterized by complete devotion to the principle that the Rebbe's relationship with his students should reflect the same degree of love and commitment that a parent has for a child.

HaRav Aharon Bina, Rosh HaYeshiva, relates to each student like a son, personally monitoring each student's academic, religious, and emotional growth throughout the year.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME

Our beautiful complex, home to Yeshivat Netiv Aryeh, combines historical beauty with advanced modern technology. Its proximity to the site of the Beit HaMikdash is breathtaking as well as inspiring.

The students can almost be seen as "guardians of the Mikdash," a role traditionally assumed by the Leviim.

The focal point of our building is our spacious airconditioned Beit Midrash located on the third floor and overlooking the Kotel HaMa'aravi. In addition, the building includes a library, dining room, offices, and classrooms.

Another highlight of the building is the large porch on the second floor, which stands directly across from the Kotel. This space functions as both a place to go for a breath of fresh air and as a spiritually inspiring site that provides an opportunity to feel close to the House of Hashem.

And of course, understanding that a young man cannot develop spiritually without proper nourishment, the Yeshiva provides three meals daily. A highlight of our week is our Shabbat meal environment. In addition to our in-Shabbatot the dining room is also open and functional on all non-mandatory or out-Shabbatot, and even during periods like Pesach when the Yeshiva is not in session. Indeed, a highlight of the Pesach recess is the student-run Second Seder in the yeshiva dining room.

The Yeshiva's Administrative Israel offices are all located in the same building as the Beit Midrash. The staff works tirelessly to ensure that the Yeshiva runs smoothly. The student's needs are always at the top of their list of priorities.

The Yeshiva's accommodations are located within a few minute's walk from the main building. More than half of the dorm rooms face the Western Wall and Plaza, offering a stunning view of the Har Habayit and its environs. There are three to six residents per room, with each room containing ample closet space and sleeping accommodations. In addition to the students, dormitory counselors are present within the building. Access to the building is via two coded combination locks.

The dorm buildings, which are fully heated and air-conditioned, contain over one hundred beds with the amenities required to ensure the comfort of a student away from home. This includes a mini-workout room, laundry area, student lounge, and dining area.



THE ULTIMATE ISRAEL EXPERIENCE





The Yeshiva believes that the life of a Torah Jew extends outside of the Beit Midrash as well. Trips throughout the year have an educational as well as recreational focus, instilling in the students a commitment and love for the Land of Israel and the State of Israel and providing them the opportunity to strengthen their relationships with each other.

Unique to Yeshivat Netiv Aryeh is the requirement that Rebbeim participate in the tiyulim - many of whom bring their families along. This provides the student with another venue to interact with the Rebbe in a more casual setting, fostering a closer relationship.

The tiyulim include day-trips as well as overnights. For the first few weeks of the year, a few hours a week are devoted to walking tours around Yerushalayim and the Kotel Tunnel Tours. Tzom Gedaliah is traditionally highlighted by a visit to Ma'arat HaMachpela.

Overnight tiyulim include a two-night trip to southern Eretz Yisrael before Chanukah and a tour of the Galil in mid-winter. These overnights include hikes, canoeing, rafting, and other ways of having fun as well as developing a love for the Land of Israel. Other full-day trips include a visit to an army and air force base, and a day of fun in a water park. Periodic recreational outtings include trips to a local sports center where students enjoy the swimming pool, tennis and basketball courts, and more.

The grand finale of the year is the grand siyum in celebration of the whole Yeshiva completing a masechet of Gemara. The evening includes dancing, divrei Torah, and words of parting from the Rosh Yeshiva, HaRav Nebenzahl, other Rebbeim, and students.









The Yeshiva views participation in chesed activities as an integral part of the development of a ben Torah. We therefore, strongly encourage students to take advantage of such endeavours during their free time.

In addition to various organizations that we volunteer with, the Yeshiva runs a number of its own chesed programs, including its very own "Shuk Shleppers" who are on alert at the local outdoor market to help the many elderly visitors with their shopping. The Yeshiva also has its very own chesed band ("The Shtark Side of the Moon") that performs for numerous venues and occasions to brighten the days of so many, and a Bikkur Cholim Crew who spend their Thursdays entertaining the patients at various local hospitals. Additionally, the Yeshiva runs their very own carnivals and events for children.

Character development and love of chesed is such an important goal for Yeshiva life, that in most years more than half of the Camp HASC (Hebrew Academy for Special Children) boys' division staff consists of current students or alumni. One of the highlights of the summer at Camp HASC is a Shabbat with our Rosh Yeshiva, HaRav Bina shlit"a.

Our British Programme has been specifically designed to provide a pastoral facility for our students from the UK. The programme includes special Shabbatonim and shiurim exclusively for British students.

The programme is under the Directorship of Rabbi Mark Mays, who has studied for semicha and is continuing his learning in the Yeshiva, since returning to Israel in the year 5763 after six years as a Youth Director in London. Rabbi Mays makes himself available to British students who need healp in learning or simply need someone to talk to.

Born and bred in the UK, Rav Mark Mays was a Youth Director in London for 6 years.

With a degree from UCL (University College London), Rav Mays came to Israel to learn for Smicha, and so far has ended up staying in Israel, Currently teaching at Yeshivat Netiv Aryeh in the old city of Jerusalem, he also serves as our British Programme Coordinator.

THE BRITISH PROGRAMME





The Sephardi program is headed by HaRav Eliyahu Zadok & HaRav Yaakov Darmoni. It begins with a separate daily Shacharit minyan, adhering strictly to Nusach Edot HaMizrach and making use of a Sephardi Sefer Torah procured by the Yeshiva for that purpose. The program also includes special shiurim focusing on halacha and minhagim based on the writings of Sephardi poskim, visits to Sephardi gedolim and get-togethers in the homes of some of the program's Rebbeim.

The Sephardic track curriculum has been carefully developed to include exploration of Sephardic culture, halacha, and the teachings of chachmei sefarad. Unique to this program is the yeshivas emphasis on the Sephardic way of learning and the overall commitment to the Sephardic philosophy. Alumni of the program remain in contact with each other and with the Yeshiva even upon returning to their homes. Shabbatonim and Melave Malkes, often attended by Rabbanim of the program, take place in the United States and other parts of the Diaspora. In keeping with the goal of educating each student in a way most suitable for him, the Yeshiva has created a special program for Sephardim. Although much of the day is spent learning in the Beit Midrash and in shiurim alongside their Ashkenazi brethren, the Yeshiva appreciates the importance of keeping the traditions forged for us by our ancestors.

Created as a program within a program, the Sephardic learning track at Netiv Aryeh is an integral and vibrant part of the greater Netiv Aryeh program with the goal of developing, strengthening and preserving Sephardic Torah learning, traditions and culture.

Sephardic track students take full advantage of all the resources found at Netiv Aryeh. This includes the Rennert Kollel where many of our scholars are of Sephardic origin.

In closely-knit groups, students are encouraged to actively participate in shiurim and to ask halacha and hashkafa-based questions. Morning classes follow the same schedule as the general program and afternoon classes are unique to the Sephardic program. Individual classes in specially requested topics are available upon request. Students who prefer to join the general program classes should feel free to do so. All students are encouraged to participate in special activities of both the Netiv Aryeh program, as well as the Sephardic program.

Afternoon Seder YOU CHOOSE YOUR FIT

Students choose from a wide variety of topics in small groups or Chaburot starting at 3:30 PM. There are three learning slots, Shiurim range from more Gemara, Tanach, Mussar, Hashkafa, current events, reasons for Miztvot, Arab-Israeli conflict, different levels of Ulpan (learning Hebrew), or just shmoozing with your rabbi.

Although emphasis is placed on developing a love and proficiency for learning Gemara, the Yeshiva offers a wide range of additional opportunities for the student to find and develop himself.

The Afternoon Program begins with a choice of shiurim ranging from other chapters in the Massechet studied, other Massechtot, and Tanach. This is followed by a choice between afternoon seder


and a variety of shiurim, including the popular Ulpan program. Those who choose to remain in the Beit Midrash during this time have the opportunity for a private chavruta with one of our Israeli or English-speaking Kollel members.

Night Seder ONE-ON-ONE LEARNING

The well-staffed night seder program provides the students with an opportunity to expand their interests in learning and to interact with the Rebbeim. Many choose to review what they have learned in the morning while others concentrate on completing the Massechet they started or learn other Gemaras. Others choose to avail themselves of an opportunity to become well-versed in other areas such as Halacha, Parshat Hashavua, or Chassidut.



Each first-year student spends part of his night seder learning one-on-one either with a second-year student or with one of our night seder staff members. Beyond the learning of Gemara, Halacha, or Mussar, this time of day allows the students to gain from the experience and learning prowess of their more experienced chavruta. Most importantly, it affords them a friendly advisor who understands many of the different feelings and experiences that accompany the student's growth.
