

About Yeshivat Otniel

Yeshivat Otniel is a renowned Israeli Religious Zionist yeshiva, distinguished for its high-caliber Torah study, emphasizing both depth and breadth. Blending rigorous Talmudic learning with philosophy and mysticism, the yeshiva fosters an environment of

intellectual exploration and spiritual growth. Our curriculum - made up of mornings and evenings studying Gemara and afternoons of elective courses and personal learning - sharpens students' analytical skills and develops a profound connection to G-d and Torah.

Yeshivat Otniel is one of Israel's largest Hesder Yeshivot with over 300 students. Around 65 students join the Yeshiva each year out of high school, most return after their army service, and around 25 students stay to study for Semicha. In addition to the students who learn in the Beit Midrash, Otniel's impact far transcends its walls through a robust online presence of shiurim and podcasts and the Yeshiva's publishing house *Gilui* (literally: Revelation).

Our English Speakers Program enables a successful integration into the Yeshiva while providing specialized classes, experiences, guidance, and community.

VISION
G-d is revealed anew each and every day and in each and every individual. Founded on this belief, Yeshivat Otniel strives to serve as a meeting point between Heaven and Earth.

Just like the sunset in which the world bursts into color when night and day meet, our Beit Midrash radiates its unique light as it brings into harmony past and present, the intellectual and the spiritual, learning and doing.

Past and Present G-d's word was revealed at Har Sinai, and it is the unique perspectives brought by each of its students that brings about its flowering, its living continuous revelation. We study with reverence and deference to the wisdom of Torah scholars throughout the generations, and we listen intently to the insights of the present moment. We see ourselves as a continuation of the story of the Jewish people as we turn our attention to the world in which we live and the challenges it presents today.

The Intellectual and the Spiritual Just like a bird needs both of its wings to take flight, it is our belief that full Avodat Hashem requires a partnership between thought and emotion. Rigorous intellectual study in the Beit Midrash is informed by singing, dancing, and meditation, and one's inner world is shaped by the ideas they study. Brought into harmony, both the Torah and the individual soar to new horizons.

Learning and Doing The Torah calls us both to study and to act. In our learning, we hear and reveal G-d's word, and in our doing of the mitzvot, we partner with G-d in creating and repairing the world. Our thorough Torah study enriches our observance of Halacha. We believe in a balance between service of G-d within the Beit Midrash and without - both during and after their time within our walls, our talmidim live lives of service to our People, and our Hesder students serve in the IDF to protect Eretz Yisrael and Am Yisrael.

Our Yeshiva formally refers to itself as a Beit Vaad, a term from Pirkei Avot that refers to a house of meeting for debate amongst scholars. This is our vision. Our talmidim are not passive recipients; through humility, rigor, and deeply refined listening, each student is an active participant in the revelation of G-d's word through our Torah and the living of a holy life that follows - in the union of Heaven and Earth.

Some Elements of the Yeshiva

Talmud Study. The pulsating heart of our Beit Midrash is the study of Talmud, for it is in its pages and commentaries that one hears the Torah's insights into every element of existence and is in turn invited to express

their unique creativity. Our analysis of the Psukim, Midrashim, Mishna, Gemara, Rishonim, and Achronim works to organize the different opinions and glean their Halachik and theological implications. Our approach to iyun (in-depth study) is rooted in classical Talmudic methodologies, utilizes tools from the academic study of Talmud such as the chronological development of ideas and literary theories, and invites the existential insights of each individual learner. A Wide Range of Voices and of Classes. Otniel is truly a Beit Vaad, a place of meeting for an array of voices and perspectives. All those who live a life of Torah and Yirat Shamayim are invited to bring their opinion to the debates within our walls. This diversity of thought is reflected in our large staff of Rabbis - with widely varying approaches to learning and areas of expertise - and their classes that span the entire Torah spectrum - from Tanach to Mishna to Talmud to Halacha to Jewish Philosophy to Kaballah to Chassidut.

A Personalized Curriculum. Each student who enters Yeshiva is on their own personal journey of Avodat Hashem. Each student arrives with their own goals for learning, their specific set of skills, their personal interests and questions. After the first weeks in Yeshiva in which we encourage our students to try out as many classes as possible, we work with each student to chart their goals and craft a personal schedule

with a mix of the Yeshiva's Hebrew classes, English classes, chevrutot, and personal learning time in the Beit Midrash.

Avodat Hashem Beyond the Mind. We hear and connect to G-d in ways that transcend verbal rational articulation. Otniel strives to foster in its students avenues of connection to Hashem beyond intellectual study. Our tefillot are famous both for their slow meditative nature as well as their joyous singing and dancing. We prepare ourselves for Maariv each night in dance, offer classes that teach and explore niggunim, and regularly have late night Hitvaaduyot (gathering of singing and Divrei Torah). Multiple times a year we head out to nature, and an annual highlight is our Beit Midrash for Creativity in which students are invited to create and share art of all forms.

Immersion in a Rural Israeli Environment. Students who choose to study in Otniel grow immensely from integrating fully into an Israeli Yeshiva - learning Torah and experiencing life from a new perspective. While the Yeshiva is only a 75 minute bus ride from Jerusalem, our students have the opportunity to live in a small warm rural community and enjoy the insights that come from serenity, focus, and the daily sunsets that flood the Beit Midrash with golden light.



Yeshivat Otniel's English Speakers Program

Our Mission

The Torah of Otniel may be the exact language of Torah that English speaking students are looking

for, but it is taught in a spoken language that is not their mother tongue and within a foreign cultural context. It is the goal of our program to enable the successful integration of English speakers as they fully immerse themselves in an Israeli Yeshiva. Further, the Yeshiva yearns to develop its Torah through the insights of students from English speaking communities who offer different perspectives and grapple with their own questions.

Who is the program for?

Our program is for highly motivated students with a desire to deeply immerse themselves in the world of Torah in an intellectual and spiritual

way and to do so in an Israeli environment. As the majority of the students' classes and chevrutot will be in Hebrew, success in Otniel requires a high level of Hebrew in addition to a strong foundation in studying Torah, specifically the Gemara and its commentaries.

A Community Within a Community

Part of the power of learning in Otniel is being within a huge Beit Midrash, feeling the electricity of so many engaged in fervorous study, learning amongst true giants of Torah. The goal of the English Speakers Program is to create a home

within the larger Yeshiva in which English Speaking students can feel totally comfortable to speak their own language, to talk about shared experiences, and to discuss questions and topics that may be unique to

them. This takes the form of one or two daily classes in English, weekly gatherings with the English speaking Rebeyim, trips throughout the year, and simply having one another with whom to hang out. Even as the students integrate deeply within the Israelis Yeshiva community, it is these comfortable familiar interactions that ensure vitality and successful immersion.

Torah Specifically for English
Speaking Students
The Torah of Otniel is taught at a very high level, and most students (Israelis included) gain deepest access to the Torah being taught with systems of support. Courses will be taught in support. Courses will be taught in

English to bolster students' technical skills and their understanding of methodologies and concepts. Additionally, new classes will be taught that are aimed at making the Torah of Otniel maximally relevant to the lived experience and questions of students from an English Speaking culture.

Patience and Determination

Spending every day in a place that feels different from home and studying all day in a foreign language can be challenging. It can

take time to really feel that one is integrating into the Yeshiva and deeply understanding what is being taught, and it is the goal of our program to help shorten this transition period. Some students arrive with gaps in their learning skills and others who need to grow in Hebrew fluency, but with patience and determination, our students become integral parts of the Yeshiva community and gain access to the life changing Torah of Otniel.



Rav Re'em HaCohen Rosh Yeshiva

Rav Re'em has been Rosh Yeshiva and the Rav of the Otniel community for over 30 years, and is widely considered one of

the Gdolei Hador. Renowned for his sharp, precise, and creative analysis, he sets a tone of learning Torah vigorously with the aspitation of hearing G-d's will anew. He has published an array of books in Talmudic insights (5 volumes thus far published of *Shiurei HaRev Re'em* - Talmudic Lessons), halachic responsa (5 volumes thus far published of *Shu"t Bidei HaAron* - Poles of the Ark: Topical Halachic Responsa), and Jewish thought (among them *He'eh'lem VeGilui* - The Hidden and the Revealed), and is a public figure working towards elevating and unifying the Jewish People.



Rav Elchanan Cherlow Rosh Yeshiva

After years in the Yeshiva as a student and then a Ra"m, Rav Elchanan was recently appointed Rosh Yeshiva, and he brings a youthful energy

as the Yeshiva strives to both deepen and grow with a new generation. His lessons often focus on how the Torah speaks directly to the soul, and his pedagogical philosophy emphasises the importance of every Rabbi seeing the personal journey of each of their students. He has an MA in Educational Psychology and ran a private clinic alongside his teaching before his recent appointment as Rosh Yeshiva.



Rav Benny Kalmanzon President

Rav Benny was the founding Rosh Yeshiva of Otniel and recently transitioned to President of the Yeshiva. He built the Yeshiva on a vision wherein the students do not

come to be told what to think but where they think for themselves and where deep learning and spirituality are not at odds but complementary. He is a scholar of art, literature, philosophy, and Holocaust studies, and incorporates all of these into the Chassidut classes that he still teaches in the Yeshiva.

Rav Alex grew up in Houston, Texas, and made aliyah after studying philosophy at the University of

After receiving a teacher's certificate from Herzog College and completing the Ohr Torah Stone Strauss-Amiel rabbinic and emissary training program, Rav Netzach spent 3 years in San Diego serving as the Rav of SCY High School and the Youth Director at Congregation Adat Yeshurun. Rav Netzach lives in Otniel with his wife and four children.

I think there are two driving forces that give our Beit Midrash a special flavor.


On one hand there is a stress on the spiritual aspects of Judaism - the study of Chassidut and Kabbalah and how that is translated into music, tefillah, and meditation.
